



The Inland Power & Light Pre-Apprenticeship Lineman Scholarship Program

Do you like to work outdoors? The line construction trade is a rewarding career with exceptional pay and benefits. As one of the northwest's largest electric cooperatives, Inland Power & Light is pleased to support those individuals interested in the Line Construction trade by awarding up to three \$1,000 scholarships annually. Our desire is to develop a qualified pool of candidates for future positions in the electric utility industry.

A. Scholarship Program Definition

- a. The program is for active Inland Power members and their children/legal dependents. (Legal dependent is defined as one who is claimed on their parent or guardian's tax return.)
- b. Students must be at least 18 years old and be a high school graduate or hold a GED.
- c. Pass a doctor's review to be physically able to perform work of the industry including climbing poles.
- d. Agree to comply with a drug and alcohol policy which may include testing.
- e. Valid driver's license and Class A Commercial Driver's license are required while enrolled in line worker program.

B. Scholarship Program Application

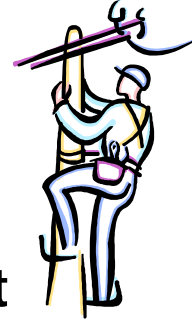
- a. Students need to submit a completed application form.
- b. Submit an official copy of your high school transcript or GED.
- c. Include two letters of reference.
- d. Submit an essay describing in 250 – 500 words, why you are a good candidate for the lineman program such as: Why are you interested in this type of work? What special skills would you bring to the job?
- e. Applications and the required information must be received at Inland's office at 10110 W Hallett road by 5:00 pm on April 15th or postmarked April 15th.

C. Scholarship Program Administration

- a. An all-volunteer cooperative member committee comprised of approximately five to ten members will make the selection of the scholarship recipients.
- b. Upon selection and official enrollment to line construction school, scholarship checks will be paid directly to the school.
- c. Scholarship recipients are not required to work at Inland Power following their training, nor does Inland Power guarantee positions.
