Candidate statement:

I am proud to be an IPL member and truly honored to have served the Inland membership as an elected trustee/board member. Some highlights during my years of board service have been:

- 1. Supporting the new IPL headquarters building at Four Lakes, (we relocated our administrative offices from downtown Spokane) which combined our administrative employees and facility with our line crew employees and warehouse facility.
- 2. Investing in an AMR (Automatic Meter Reading) program which has enabled us to better track outages and restore power quickly and efficiently, as well as improve billing accuracy and troubleshoot and diagnose issues over nearly 8,000 miles of line.
- 3. Establishing long-term financial stability through investment in a Bonneville Power Administration prepayment of services program benefiting our members for 15 years.

Why do you want to serve on the board of trustees?

While our future looks bright, we do have some challenges ahead. Like you, I am a member of Inland Power & Light and rely on IPL for exceptional service and dependable electric power at competitive rates. I'm a true believer in the cooperative model that is guided by the cooperative principles and our member participation.
